Council Tax up nearly 5%

At the recent East Dorset District Council meeting, Liberal Democrat Deputy Leader Don Wallace (supported by Janet Dover) proposed seven reductions to the 2006-2007 budget.

Unfortunately, all were voted down 21-9 by the Conservative group.

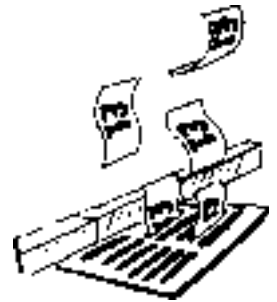
Thus, the Council Tax for Band D households in Colehill will be £1361.79 (excluding the Parish Council charge) Bands E to H will of course be considerably higher.

Massive increase since 2001

In 2001 when the Council was Liberal Democrat controlled, there was zero debt. The Council tax for a Band D property was £931.92

The latest figures for the Conservative Controlled Dorset County Council represent a massive increase in Council Tax to £1361.79 for a Band D property up (46%). As well as increasing Council Tax, East Dorset District Council is now in debt of 140 million pounds.

Despite having a larger government grant (£290 million) and increasing Council Tax by nearly half, the County Council's debts have soared under Conservative control.



Nationally the Liberal Democrats are the only party committed to scrapping the unfair Council Tax.

600 new dwellings in Colehill

This large scale building development has been mooted for the Green Belt land adjoining Burts Hill.

One major concern would be increased traffic along Middlehill Road, running through the centre of Colehill village. Workers from Burts Hill commuting to Bournemouth would understandably take the short cut (via Smugglers Lane to Middlehill Road) to avoid Wimborne's traffic.

Should the intention to build on Green Belt land be confirmed, Don, who sits on the District Planning Committee and County Councillor Janet Dover are prepared to oppose.

Development danger on Colehill School site

Conservative waste at County Hall

Cuts hit elderly & vulnerable

Inefficiency and financial mismanagement by the Conservatives at County Hall mean that the elderly and vulnerable are going to suffer.

Since taking control the conservatives have:

- Cut talking books for the blind
- Reduced the number of adult fitness and education programmes
