## Pat Hymers

Pat has lived at 14 Westfield Close in Wimborne since the family came to the town in 1972. She then started Wimborne Playschool, the Mother and Toddler Group, the Toy Library and the Wimborne Opportunity Group for under 5's with special needs.

From 1982 her positive actions led to:- The establishment and re-opening of Wimborne Model Town on its new site, the Planet Information and Advice Centre for young people, the Dorset Pre-School Centre in King Street (now the Community Learning Centre), the retention of Streets Meadow in the town centre and a lorry ban to protect the town centre.

Elected to the District Council in 1983 and to the County Council in 1985, she has topped the poll at all subsequent elections. **She was Town Mayor in 1988/89. From 1993 to 2001 she was Chairman of Dorset County Council, the only woman to have ever held that position.**

In April 2000, she led a team of volunteers to bring back public rowing on the River Stour. ([www.dream-boats.org.uk](http://www.dream-boats.org.uk))

She is well known as a good listener, persuasive speaker and is always willing to take up individual cases. She is married with 3 daughters.

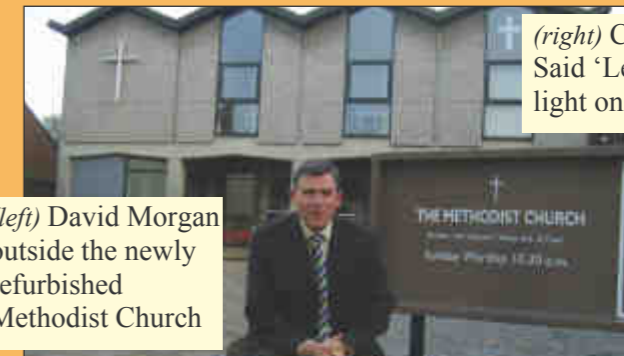

He has been involved with youth work at Wimborne Youth Centre for all of that time.** He helped form the Planet Advice Centre and as part of his commitment to improve youth facilities he is a leading member of the working team, as treasurer, which aims to build a new Youth and Community Centre at the Reef in Colehill to serve both Wimborne and Colehill

David is well known in many Wimborne circles for his other community work:- being involved in Dreamboats, Wimborne Horticulture Society, Vision Wimborne and Friends of East Dorset C.A.B. As a Councillor this work has helped him to assess the needs of the community and to give support where needed.

During his time as a Councillor he has enabled improvements on roads and pavements in the area and lighting by the river. He is also supporting the Leigh Park Residents in improving their area. He has led inquiry teams on the Council to push for more affordable homes and most recently he has been involved in reviewing the grants system available for community facilities.

## Marilyn Osner

Marilyn has lived in Wimborne since 1975 and is the widow of Dr Robin Osner, a former Councillor. Marilyn has two daughters who attended local schools. Marilyn took early retirement from her career, which spanned actuarial work in London Finance, The Foreign Office, Inland Revenue, Social Services and NHS nursing locally. Marilyn has eight years experience in local government. In 1995, she was first elected as an East Dorset Councillor and in 2001 she was elected County Councillor for Minster Division. At County, Marilyn is a member of the main Social Services Scrutiny Committee and various other panels dealing with Education and Social Services

appeals, Fostering, Personnel, Arts and Environmental Matters.

Marilyn is involved in many local associations as a committee member or as a friend. These include Vision Wimborne, Dial-a-ride, a local Housing Association, Wimborne Youth Club, The East Dorset Community Health and Youth Forums, Wimborne Hospital and Streets Meadow.

Marilyn is very much a community person and listens and acts on the needs of local people of all ages. **In 1996 her work was recognised when she won "The Real Woman of Dorset Medal" presented by the Daily Echo.**
